The manufacturer shall register products in Guyana. Complete Dossiers are needed to be submitted in duplicate copies with a cover letter, addressed to the Registrar, Pesticides and Toxic Chemicals Control Board, NAREI Compound, Mon Repos, East Coast Demerara. A new product registration takes the maximum of 3 months to be completely reviewed, and short comings of the submission would be indicated to the company.

Each study that is provided for chemical and physical properties must be accompanied with their respective laboratory studies of the formulated product, stamped and signed by the testing laboratory. We in Guyana use the FAO/WHO CODEX alimentarius MRLs, this means each product been registered needs to have relevant studies to support each post harvest interval which will be visible on the label. This will give the required MRLs for the intended crops once the PHI is strictly observed. Complete research documents are required on the formulated product and not just test results, also each page of the document needs to be stamped with the testing laboratory official stamp and signature to authenticate these documents.

All requirements listed in the REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE PESTICIDES AND TOXIC CHEMICALS CONTROL ACT 2000 (No. 13 of 2000) must be satisfactorily fulfilled.

In the case of products originating from China, a "ICAMA" certificate must form part of the registration submission.
